Lighting the Advent Wreath

As we light the candles in our Advent Wreath we
remember the preparations which God our Father
made for the coming of his Son into the world.

The previous Sunday's candles are lit

Our first candle reminds us of the patriarchs who
looked forward to the coming of Jesus. Our second
candle reminds us of the prophets who told of the
coming messiah. Our third candle reminds us of John
the Baptist who came to prepare the way for the
Lord. Our fourth candle reminds us of Mary who was
obedient and became the mother of Jesus.

The centre candle is lit

God our Father, today the saviour is born and those
who live in darkness are seeing a great light. Help us,
who greet the birth of Christ with joy, to live in the
light of your Son and to share the good news of your
love. We ask this through Jesus Christ, the light who
has come into the world.

Amen.

Lord Jesus, Light of Light,
you have come among us.
Help us who live by your light
