

# St Luke's Community Hub Project




Our 125th Anniversary in 2025 gives us a great opportunity to celebrate and to look forward to a new chapter.

The project achieved full Planning Consent in 2021.










What St Luke's Community Hub project will bring...

## Without St Luke's Community Hub

Every entrance to the church and hall buildings re is no physical connection between buildings.

has steps and there is no physical connection between buildings. The toilets and kitchen are located in the hall involving a journey outside for people in the church to access them

Toilet facilities are unattractive and difficult to keep clean and the so-called accessible toilet is a standard larger cubicle with some ad-hoc aids

Shabby and decaying premises hinder welcome by hiding the vibrant life of St Luke's

Lack of insulation in existing hall building is hugely wasteful and environmentally damaging

Use of fossil fuels for heating

Water ingress and decaying woodwork require increasingly costly maintenance

Activities risk closure through building breakdown

No Audio Visual facilities in hall building

Poor kitchen facilities where fresh food cannot be prepared or cooked

A pioneering Eco Church with an A Rocha Silver award will be unable to progress to Gold

## With St Luke's Community Hub

**Step free access** into, within and between our buildings opens doors to **wheelchair** users and people with **limited mobility** 

Fully **accessible**, **gender neutral** toilet provision opens doors for people who are **wheelchair** users, have **limited mobility** or are **transgender/non-binary** 

A **modern,** pleasant, looked-after space with good facilities and a very **low carbon footprint** opens doors for people to use and enjoy it, making the facilities available for a broader section of the community and with a broader range of activities. This is particularly true for **youth work** which is one of our priorities

A comprehensive Audio Visual installation in all spaces opens doors for people who are **hard of hearing, neurodivergent, dyslexic** and those who are **housebound** 

A catering standard kitchen enables us to prepare, cook and serve waste food and offer cooking classes, opening doors for people to make their own low cost healthy meals

An A Rocha Gold award will be possible

# How might we accomplish this?

St Luke's Community Hub is a modest project that will bring massive benefits to the community and to the church and will transform what St Luke's is able to contribute to our community.

# Phase 1: Cost £120,000 - Completed Spring 2022

- Level access entrances to Church building with new main entrance doors
- New porch and level access between Nave and Lady Chapel
- Glazed infill to arches between Chancel and side chapels giving independent meeting spaces



#### Phase 2: Cost £760,500

- Demolish and rebuild the hall including a new secure physical entrance link to the church building extending the existing footprint of the hall by about 4.3 metres creating:
- Accessible toilets
- ☐ Catering standard kitchen
- ☐ New Community Hall space and storage
- Renewable energy heating and power
- Integrated Audio Visual systems in both buildings to improve accessibility
- Associated external landscaping including a dropped kerb/parking space on the Burton Stone Lane frontage for a funeral hearse/ blue badge parking

## 'Clear, hold, build' in Clifton

# Anna Harrison, the City of York Council Local Area Co-ordinator for the Clifton Ward, says:

The Home Office initiative 'Clear, Hold, Build' has been operating in Clifton since March 2024. The three stage program aims to "clear" the community of serious and organised crime as well as tackling anti-social behaviour. The "hold" phase intends to ensure that other criminals do not step into the gap left by those who have been cleared from the area and "build" pulls in local residents as well as statutory and voluntary organisations to ensure that Clifton continues to be a safe and enjoyable place to live.

The "Build" phase very much relies on local resources to meet the needs of the Community. Currently there is a shortage of community assets that can be used to further this work. This Community Hub development at St Luke's would provide the people of Clifton with a modern, safe, flexible and welcoming space where the Church can continue their vital work tackling poverty and social isolation and other organisations can be brought in. These organisations would be able to further the work of the Church itself by providing services to tackle health inequalities and issues around mental health and addiction as well as Adult Education and Training.

St Luke's is known across our community as a church that cares and makes a difference. With Luke's Larder, Joyful Connections and other activities the church organises, they do much to enhance the lives of our residents.

We know that they want to do more, but are restricted by their limited facilities, with an ageing wooden hall building which is loved and cared for, but is no longer fit for purpose.

The priorities that we have set for our Ward through consultation with our residents reflect the very things that we know are important to St Luke's, so we feel a real sense of partnership with the church in what we are doing to try and make lives better for those in our community.

The new Community Hub building, together with the willing and enthusiastic volunteers from St Luke's and other organisations, will be able to open many more doors for our residents. This comes at a critical time when there is a major police led, multi-agency initiative in Clifton, 'Clear Hold Build', moving towards the 'build' point where we want to improve the living, working and recreational environment in the community for our residents. This stage of the initiative empowers them to work with stakeholders to generate resilience and build a safer community. We see the St Luke's Community Hub project as being essential to enabling this to happen.

St Luke's already has c.£300,000 available to commit to the project and we are continuing to raise funds ourselves to close the gap, aiming to raise a minimum of 10% of the remaining £460,500.
